

Penny's Recipe of the Month

Tomato, Mozzarella and Basil Salad



Serves 2 people

Ingredients: 4oz mozzarella cheese sliced,

24 fresh basil leaves, 1lb fresh tomatoes.

As in my last recipe put the tomatoes in a bowl and pour boiling hot water over them. Leave for a minute then drain and slip off the skins. Then slice the tomatoes thinly. Now in a serving dish arrange the slices of mozzarella and tomatoes in layers. Scatter the whole basil leaves over the top then just before serving sprinkle salt and freshly milled pepper and drizzle with olive oil all over. Serve with some warmed ciabatta bread. Whilst this is a quick recipe if we get a lovely sunny day who wants to be cooking in the kitchen for a long time?....I don't.

I had a lovely text the other day from a neighbour saying that they had cooked my recipe of roasted red peppers and how much her family had enjoyed it and it was now one of their favourites which made my day. So I hope you enjoy this one.
