August

Just a few fun facts about this fabulous month which, in 8 BC, was named in honour of the Roman emperor Augustus. It is also unique in that, in a standard year, there is no other month that begins on the same day of the week as August. In a leap year, however, August begins on the same day of the week as February.



One flower associated with August is the gladiolus which represents strength of character, honesty, generosity and moral integrity- so those of you born in August have a lot to live up to. The name is from the Latin 'gladius' which means sword and links to their pointy sword like shape which is possibly why the Romans used to throw them to winning gladiators! In Sara Coleridge's poem about the months of the year the lines,

' August brings the sheaves of corn,

Then the harvest home is born'

remind us that the 1st August, Lammas Day, used to be harvest time in England. The word comes from the Anglo Saxon for Loaf Mass when people went to church to give thanks for the first corn harvested and farmers made loaves of bread from the first crop which were used for the Communion service. DIGGING INTO THE PAST...1937

BRAMSHALL PARISH PCC MEETING

A Parochial Church Council Meeting was held on Wednesday 10th February 1937 in the Parish Hall at 8pm.

- Apology: The Vicar who was unable to attend.
- Present: Mr H Statham Vice Chairman in the chair, Rev. A G Prime Curate

Mr J H Lindop – Vicars Warden, Mr F. Searle – People's Warden

Messrs: R & E Whittaker, T. Durose, H. Potter, J. Adams, J C DeVille Secretary.

Electric Light Installation - Two tenders were received, Messrs J. Richards – Longton and Mr J H Ryder – Uttoxeter. There was very little difference in the amount after a discussion it was proposed by Mr R. Whittaker seconded by Mr Searle that Mr Lindop and the Secretary interview Mr Ryder and to offer him £20 for eight lights in the Church, one over the Organ, one in the Vestry, one outside and two in the Belfry.

Sunday School Account - Proposed by Mr Lindop seconded by Mr Searle that the Sunday School account in the Westminster Bank be transferred from Messrs Whittaker and Lindop to the Rev. Prime and H. Potter.

Church Cleaner - Mrs Bales gave notice that she wishes to give up her duties on Jan 1. The Ladies of the Mothers Union have been good enough to take on the duties temporarily.

Red Reading Desk - It was decided to ask the Vicar if we could give the red Reading Desk to any other Church or Mission Room. It was also decided to buy a new chair for the Vestry.

Minutes - The minutes of the last Vestry were read, confirmed and signed by the Chairman.

Wardens - Proposed by Mr Whittaker Snr seconded by Mr Statham that both Wardens be re-elected. This ended the meeting.

Accounts - The Secretary presented the accounts which showed a balance in hand of $\pounds 25.9.11$ against $\pounds 28.16.8$ the previous year. This was considered satisfactory, and it was proposed by Mr Whittaker Snr seconded by Mr Searle that the accounts be passed.

Sunday School - It was decided to give £5 as last year to the Sunday School.

Church Windows - Several members brought forward the bad state of the church windows and there is a danger of them falling out. It was thought they might be supported with copper rods or stays. The Vicar promised to see Mr Phillips in Uttoxeter.

Coronation - It was decided to have a short service in the Church – the time to be fixed later.

Amalgamation with Uttoxeter - A discussion took place as whether Bramshall had suffered "spiritually" by the amalgamation with Uttoxeter, and the general opinion was that it had not.

Matting - Miss Statham proposed and Mr Whittaker seconded that matting be bought for the church – carried. It was decided to leave the matter in the hands of Miss Statham to purchase.

Book Shelf - It was decided to have a shelf or box, fixed inside the church for books and sell the Church lamps if possible.

Before departing the Vicar expressed his thanks to all who had assisted in the good work of the church during the past year and particularly the Church Wardens who suitably responded. W E Charlton20/4/38

Church Clock

A letter was read from Messrs J Smith & Sons, Derby which stated that the Clock was beyond repair and advised either a new one or they could supply a good reconditioned second hand one with a 27yr guarantee, their own make for £48. The only extra would be a little joinery work. The Vicar said the Brewery Clock had been dismantled and was on sale and he promised to make enquiries and report. It was decided the Secretary write to Messrs Smith & Son to enquire the price of the clock and fixing separately.

Carpet - It was decided to buy a carpet from Messrs G. Orme & Sons for £14. Miss Statham said she had been promised £5, the Rev G A Prime intimated that he could raise $\pounds 5$ from an entertainment, both offers being very much appreciated.

Windows - A discussion followed re condition of the windows and the Vicar promised to see Messrs Phillips & Sons re supports for same.

Accounts - These were presented, and it was proposed by Mr Searle and seconded by Mr Adams that this be paid – carried

Church Cleaning - The Vicar tendered his thanks to those members of the Mothers Union who took the responsibility of cleaning the Church which is very much appreciated.

The Secretary was instructed to see Mr Ryder re Power Plug.

Penny's Recipe of the Month

Caesar Salad



Every Sunday we have a roast meal so the first Sunday I do roast chicken, 2nd Sunday roast beef, 3rd Sunday roast lamb and the 4th Sunday either roast pork or roast ham joint. When I do roast chicken as there are only two of us eating it generally there is always a good half chicken left so during the week I make my own version of Caesar salad.

Using the chicken breast I break it into thick chunks, pan fry some streaky bacon till crispy then place it on some kitchen paper to soak up all the grease and leave it to cool a few minutes.

Wash some Little Gem lettuce, or use Iceberg lettuce if you prefer, and then tear it into pieces. Spin it in a salad spinner or wrap the lettuce in a clean tea towel and shake it hard - the tea towel ends up wet.

Put the lettuce into a pasta bowl or on individual dinner plates. Slice some tomatoes, cucumber and spring onions add to the plate, add on your chicken chunks, then break up your crispy bacon add to the salad on the plate, pour over some caesar salad sauce which you have a choice of in the supermarkets.

Finally I slice some parmigiana Reggiano cheese (Parmaesan cheese) and put on top of that lovely plateful of cold chicken salad.

If I can get a ripe avocado pear I do add that -but the pear needs to be ripe.
