



Bramshall & District Gardening Club

Once again the weather was kind for a joint visit with Stramshall Gardening Club this time to Lea Gardens near Matlock. We were told that the day we chose to go was just perfect to get the full benefit of the famous Rhododendrons and Azaleas; this year was apparently unusual in that nearly all of the flowers were out at the same time. We were amazed at the variety of colours which were displayed.

The gardens were originally set up by the local mill owner in 1935 who developed an abandoned mill-stone quarry, which happened to be a sheltered south-facing valley with acidic soil – an ideal location for Rhododendrons. The garden was designed to include both colour and scent –the latter supplied by an abundance of *Rhododendron luteum* throughout the gardens.

Lea Gardens are currently owned and managed by an ex-Vulcan bomber pilot and he told us that, although the gardens are only open for 100 days per year, he needs the other 264 days to carry out the maintenance, most of which he does himself! Certainly, everything was very well done and there was also an excellent tea shop which many of us enjoyed – altogether a very memorable day out.

The Bramshall Gardening Club is continuing its break from regular meetings over the summer and the next meeting will be on Monday 26th September when Ron Rock will present a highly-acclaimed presentation on bees.

Recipes for June

Recipe 1 Crunchie

When I visit "me" friend up in North Yorkshire I cannot resist her home-made oat crunchy biscuit/cake and the children love it.

4oz butter 4oz margarine 4oz sugar 4oz Golden Syrup 8oz Quaker Oats 4oz desiccated coconut

Melt butter, margarine, sugar and syrup in a pan. Add oats and coconut. Pour into a baking tray and bake in a moderate oven until golden brown. Take out of oven and let it cool then cut into fingers. Once completely cool, put the fingers of crunchie into a tin and layer between with greaseproof paper

Recipe 2 Butterscotch sauce

3oz brown sugar1oz butter4 tablespoons of double cream

Boil all ingredients together for 5 minutes then put into a jug and pour over a scoop or two of vanilla ice cream. Children love this also - and so do the adults!!

Two very quick, easy recipes but great for when the children are on holiday. As I said earlier, adults like the crunchie and butterscotch sauce as well ... so everybody is happy.



It's a long way from Bramshall to the Sargasso Sea!

On the 3rd May, this amazing eel was found trapped in a ditch on the McCann's family farm at Park Grange, Bramshall Road, Kiddlestich. The eel, nearly 4ft long and very slippery, was rescued by Simon McCann (pictured below on the right, with countryman Stan Stanley). Their numbers have been decimated in the last 30 years, now being officially classed as "Critically Endangered" so it was a rare opportunity to see such a wonderful specimen close-up.

The eel was released into a stream on the farm, which flows into the Picknall Brook, hopefully allowing it to continue its long journey safely. All eels return to the Sargasso Sea (in the Caribbean) to spawn - an awfully long way from here!
