#### BRAMSHALL AND DISTRICT GARDENING CLUB

At the February meeting, it was a surprise to find out that there are 45 species of dragonflies native to Britain and 30 of the species can be found in Staffordshire, including a very rare one, the White-tailed Darter. Kevin Reynolds presented some amazing photographs he had taken over the years and was a mine of information about both dragonflies and damselflies.

Apparently they spend most of their life (2-5 years) as an underwater scorpion-like larva and only emerge as a dragonfly for the last few months, the transformation process being a difficult one as they are helpless against predators. They are voracious hunters and, from Kevin's observations, they are successful 95% of the time, probably helped by their unusually large eyes, which have 30,000 lenses each!

We were very impressed that Kevin managed to take so many photographs of dragonflies at rest (and even on his hand) but, apparently, if you wait by a pond for long enough, they will eventually settle.

The next meeting will take place at Bramshall Parish Hall on **Monday 30<sup>th</sup> April at 7:30pm.** Andy Holt will be presenting some wonderful photography showing the kingfishers of Shugborough in action and talking about the study he has made of them over the years.

The accounts for 100 Club and News sheet have been verified by Marie Lowe and have been audited.





# Recipe

Oven baked chicken with garlic and parmesan.

4 chicken thighs and 4 leg portions.
4 cloves garlic.
2tbs finely chopped parsley.
2 eggs.
2 oz fresh breadcrumbs.
11/2oz parmesan cheese.
2oz butter.
4 tbsp olive oil.



Place the chicken pieces into a flat dish. Break the eggs into a bowl and whisk well. Crush the garlic, add to eggs and pour over the chicken joints. Cover the dish and put in the fridge for 3 hours. Preheat oven to 350 degrees and put in roasting tin with a knob of butter and olive oil to warm. Mix breadcrumbs together with parsley and parmesan and then coat the chicken in the mixture. Place in the roasting tin and baste. Bake on a high shelf for 20 minutes. Turn chicken over and cook for further 20mins. Pour off the fat from roasting tin then roast chicken for another 5-10mins. Serve with a green salad and baby new potatoes. Hope you enjoy *Penny Gilpin*
