As we reach the second anniversary of the commencement of 'Speedwatch' activities in the village (23/03/2017) the small team of volunteers agree that there has been a noticeable improvement in the standard of driving by most road users in the village. There remain just a few individuals who continue to threaten the safety of our roads by driving too fast but hopefully, in time, the roads will become a safer environment for everyone.

In these past two years the volunteers have noted a reduction in the number of speeding offences: this is obvious from information collected from the regular road speed monitoring sessions.

One change that has happened recently was the fitting of the new permanent warning signs at four sites on the fringes of the village; on Stone Road (2), Bennetts Lane and Leigh Lane, to alert drivers they are entering a 'Community Speedwatch' area. These metal signs replace the old, plastic, temporary ones that were used hitherto. Monitoring of the various sites will, it is hoped, further continue to reduce the level of speeding offences.

As mentioned, 'Speedwatch' in the village is undertaken by a small group of volunteers who make themselves available for a couple of hours each month. It is sometimes not possible to find enough volunteers and we are therefore seeking a few more individuals to join the team. So why not join us?

BRAMSHALL AND DISTRICT GARDENING CLUB

We were pleased to welcome Gerald Ingram of Planter's Garden Centre to our last meeting and he came with a van load of over 30 plants, including a small apple tree! These were the plants which he had found were the traditional favourites for most gardeners, mostly because they were easy to grow and look after and gave a good return, either as a display item or as a source of fruit or vegetables. He spent the evening speaking about each plant in turn and proved to be very knowledgeable about all the aspects of gardening involved.

For areas of the garden which do not get much sun, he recommended *Choisya Sundance* which has lovely gold coloured foliage together with ferns. For a north facing wall, *Hydrangea Petiolaris* will cover it well and give a very good display. He said the thing most gardeners are not good at doing is keeping plants to reasonable dimensions by pruning and he had a list of shrubs which need cutting back by half every year — Broom, Forsythia and Buddleia being three of them. It was good to have an evening which covered such a variety of plants and an expert who could give useful answers to the questions he was asked.

For the April meeting, which is the last meeting of our season, Hosta expert Robert Barlow will present an evening on this versatile and attractive herbaceous perennial. This will take place at Bramshall Parish Hall on Monday 29th April at 7:30pm.
