

2016 was an exciting and varied year for Sarah with performances with symphony orchestra and big bands, jazz quartet and duo with long time musical partner Simon Wallace. She sang Ellington at Brecon Jazz Festival with the Capital City Jazz Orchestra, and symphonic arrangements of Landesman/Wallace and Great American Songbook at Porthcawl Jazz Festival with the Rhondda Symphony Pops Orchestra. She was invited by the great octogenarian British tenor Duncan Lamont to perform material from his Songbooks alongside Norma Winstone MBE, celebrated Shakespeare's 4th Centenary singing John Dankworth's Shakespeare settings in the Music In Quiet Places Festival and took part in the 606 Club 40th Anniversary celebrations. In the EFG London Jazz Festival Sarah, composer/ pianist Simon Wallace, Ian Shaw, Nicki Leighton-Thomas and Mick Hutton launched the Landesman/Wallace Songbook Volume One.

#### RECIPE

### Speedy Beef Stroganoff

1tbsp of oil, 1lb sliced rump steak (fat cut away), 1 onion thinly sliced, 11oz button mushrooms roughly sliced, 2tbsp plain flour, 1/4 tsp paprika, 2fl -oz brandy (optional)

1/2pint beef stock, 1tbsp Dijon mustard, 1tbsp tomato puree, 3.1/2 fl. oz double cream, bunch of parsley roughly chopped.

In a large frying pan heat oil and sliced rump steak for 5 minutes. Add mushrooms and cook for a further 2 minutes. Stir in paprika and cook for 1 minute stirring all the time, then stir in the brandy (if using). Add the stock, mustard and tomato puree. Boil for a couple of minutes stirring occasionally until thickened. Add the cream and check seasoning. Sprinkle over chopped parsley and serve with pasta or rice.

#### <u>Neighbourhood Watch</u> - What is anti-social behaviour?

It can mean different things to different people - but basically anti-social behaviour (ASB) is any kind of repeat behaviour that affects the quality of life for members of the community. It can be caused by people of all ages and from different backgrounds. It is not confined to young people. Some examples:-

- large groups being rowdy and inconsiderate
- abusive language and behaviour
- underage drinking/drunkenness
- jumping and climbing on garage roofs or garden walls
- throwing items at vehicles or property
- playing 'chicken'
- bogus 999 calls
- dog fouling
- neighbour disputes
- drinking in parks

Many of these are classed as a criminal offence and can lead to prosecution. There will be regular patrols in your area by our dedicated anti-social behaviour team and your local officers. If you are experiencing any form of anti-social behaviour, contact us on 101 or speak to your local officers or Police Community Support Officers out on patrol. The PCSO for Bramshall is Craig Carroll.
