#### BRAMSHALL AND DISTRICT GARDENING CLUB

Once again we had fine weather for a joint visit with Stramshall Gardening Club to the Dorothy Clive Garden near Nantwich. The rhododendrons and azaleas were a vivid display of colour and the laburnum arch was particularly spectacular. The irises were a splendid show and the colour was just beginning to be seen in the flower borders.

The 12 acre garden was the initial creation of Colonel Harry Clive. In 1940 he decided to provide his ailing wife – Dorothy – with a 'series of interesting walks' as she battled with Parkinson's disease. Unfortunately Dorothy died in 1942 but Colonel Clive continued work apace throughout the 1940s and 1950s, especially in the Quarry Garden which covers approximately 2 acres. The garden, which now covers 12 acres, is now managed by The Willoughbridge Garden Trust who have developed several features - a winter garden, an edible woodland, a woodland quarry with waterfall, an alpine scree and pool, a sensory garden and a rose walk. A most enjoyable day out.

The next Gardening Club season begins on **Monday 24**<sup>th</sup> **September at** 7:45pm in the Bramshall Parish Hall. Exhibitor and Alpine Garden Society Judge, Diane Clement, will present an evening describing how to plant your garden so that it is 'A Garden for All Seasons'. Please put the date in your diary.

# **ROBIN HOOD SHARE CLUB**

The Robin Hood Share Club has been active in Bramshall for nearly 20 years, as its name implies it was founded at, and operated from the Robin Hood Pub and following the demise of the village pub is now headquartered at The Sycamores Church Lane, Bramshall.

Members can invest any amount in the Investment Club, with a minimum regular monthly commitment of £25. (Current members' monthly subscriptions vary between £25 and £60). Monthly meetings are held at the Sycamores at 16.00 hrs. on the second Sunday of each month and usually last about an hour. At these meetings members discuss what shares on the Stock Exchange to invest in, what shares to sell (if any), and any other relevant business. Each member has an equal vote on investment decisions regardless of their level of investment.

The Club has operated a successful investment strategy and following a change of Officers and Stock Brokers three and a half years ago cashed in the investments in the portfolio, and paid the proceeds to existing members, who realised a substantial profit. We then re- started with the core of the previous members together with some new recruits and have been building up a new portfolio since.

The new fund has a current value in excess of £16,000 and is showing a profit over the value of subscriptions paid of approximately 14%.

We currently have 14 members and are allowed a maximum by HMRC of 20, but have decided internally to limit membership to 16. We could therefore accommodate and welcome a maximum of two new members, if anyone is interested in joining. It is not obligatory to attend the meetings (in fact some members never attend), usual attendance 7-8 out of the 14 current members. It is an interesting and pleasant way to spend an hour one Sunday afternoon a month, and to date it has proved profitable, although one needs to be aware that the Stock Market can go down as well as up.

# People To Places

East Staffordshire Voluntary Car Scheme provides a service to help the elderly and those living in East Staffordshire who are unable to use public transport to make those essential journeys.

Volunteer drivers, using their own cars, offer a door to door service and will wait up to 90 minutes for the return journey.

The scheme can be used for the following:

- 1. Hospital, doctors or dentist appointments.
- 2. Hospital patient visiting.
- 3. Social visits.
- 4. Collection of prescriptions.
- 5. Shopping trips.

#### The following fees apply:

- Fees in line with recommended passenger fare table; or 45p per mile plus 5p per additional passenger.
- Escorts travel free of charge.
- Service users can also join the scheme for a £5.00 annual membership.
- Additional fees may apply, i.e., parking fees, toll fees, admin charge of £1.00 (to cover telephone calls).
