TABLE TOP SALE – SATURDAY28TH OCTOBER – 2- 4pm


If you are thinking of having a clear out before Christmas, how about booking a table in the Parish Hall to sell unwanted items?

Over the coming months there will be two other presentations on our wildlife; on these occasions the subjects will be Dragonflies and Kingfishers. Wildlife photographer Andy Holt has spent many days photographing the kingfishers on the river Trent at Shugborough and he is due to present some of the stunning results.

Gardening subjects featured in the forthcoming programme are visits by Byron Lewis of Lichfield Garden Centre who will bring along a wide range of plants for sale and give some useful tips on how to get the best displays from them and Gerald Ingram of Planters Garden Centre who will explain how to design and plant a successful patio garden. In contrast, at the November meeting, Nigel Wiggin, whose family ran the Old Hall stainless steel tableware business, is coming to talk about the history of Old Hall and he is bringing some items of the tableware which will be for sale.

Church Extension Update

Most of the 'deconstruction' has now been completed, and over the next couple of weeks we should see the new extension take shape. Access to the church is currently via the South door only as the tower section is temporarily sealed off during this phase of works.

Chain of Faith

Members of Christ Church, Tean have sent us an invitation to join them in "The chain of faith". Basically they knit chains and link them together.

If anyone is interested and likes knitting, the knitting pattern is very simple. You will need 4.5mm needles and oddments of double knitting wool. Cast on 40 stitches and knit 8 rows (garter stitch). Cast off and sew the ends together and on the second link put through the first before sewing together to form a chain effect.

OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD 2017

Christmas is fast approaching and I will be doing the **Christmas Shoe Boxes** again this year. Last year was a huge success and we packed 193 boxes from your kind donations. These boxes bring so much joy to the children who receive them (view on the Samaritan's purse web-site www.samaritan'spurse.org.uk)

Ideas for donations to go into the boxes are printed below and all donations will be gratefully received. They can be dropped off at The Sycamores, Church Lane. In order to make packing the boxes quicker and easier, we wrap the boxes a few days before packing. It is an opportunity to sit and have a chat over some light refreshments on both days.

The dates are as follows:-

Box wrapping: Wednesday afternoon 1st November 2017 between 14.00 and 16.00. **Box packing**: Saturday 4th November 2017 between 10.00am and 12.00pm **Ideas for donations.**

Hygiene items - toothbrush/paste, bar wrapped soap, flannel, comb & brush Boys & Girls - dolls/stuffed toys, small ball, puppet, small puzzles, yo-yo, balloons, small musical instrument, felt pens, pens, pencils, puzzle book, pencil case, stickers, crayons, hat/cap, gloves, scarf, sunglasses, colouring book, bag, notepad, pencil sharpener, wrapped sweets (best before date March 2018).

Boys - Cars, trucks, cap, shirt, comb

Girls - Doll, clip-on earrings, bangles, necklace, hair bands, hairbrush, soft toy. Thank you. Linda Walmsley.

<u>Recipe</u>

Leek and Potato dauphinoise.

Gently sauté 2 chopped leeks in a frying pan. Peel 500g potatoes and slice thinly. Arrange some slices in a buttered dish, scatter with leeks and add another potato layer. Crush 3 cloves of garlic into single cream, season well and pour over the vegetables. Add knobs of butter to the top and bake in hot over for 45mins or until cooked.

When cooking using cream I very often use single Elmlea as it doesn't go lumpy with heat.

Caramelised carrots.

1kg whole smaller size new seasons carrots. 2 tsp sugar, 2tbsp butter.

Put carrots in a heavy based pan and cover with water. Add a pinch of salt and bring to the boil. Simmer for 7-10mins until the carrots are tender. Drain and return to the pan with the sugar and butter, add a tablespoon of water and stir to coat the carrots with the glaze. Cook over a medium heat stirring now and then.

The butter sugar mixture will cook to a toffee-like stickiness, the carrots will be tinged brown in places. Serve hot.

Both the above dishes are delicious with roast lamb or whatever you fancy. I hope you enjoy. *Penny Gilpin*

BEST KEPT VILLAGE 2017 - JUDGES' COMMENTS - BRAMSHALL

BKV awareness was tackled through items in the Bramshall News and the village website. There was a large BKV banner at the Bramshall Road /Stocks Lane entrance feature and some BKV posters on notice boards and throughout the village.

The notice boards at the Village Hall, in the open space and at the butcher's shop were all in good condition: and notices were displayed neatly. There was a good range of up to date local information on Parish Council matters, local activities and groups, recycling and dog fouling awareness, and local events.

In May and early June the churchyard was "very neat and tidy" with well mown grass, good planting interesting wildlife areas and an unusual and very tidy small allotment area.

The Village Hall car park was very neat and tidy during the judging period, with no weeds or litter and the attractive planted areas were very well maintained.. Congratulations to all those involved for maintaining such a high standard throughout the competition.

(Judges were sorry to see the state of the Robin Hood pub). The Old Bramshall Inn surrounds and car park were tidy with no litter. The bin area was well screened and the garden looked attractive. There was an impressive shrub border at the front of the car park but many weeds and action needs to be taken soon or they could overwhelm the very attractive shrubs.

The bus shelter was in excellent condition. It was 'gleaming' inside, and there were no weeds or litter in its surrounds.

The two benches near the play area needed a clean and some paint/preservative; but their surrounds were very tidy.

There was an attractive and very well maintained stone feature "Welcome to Bramshall" with lovely planting areas at the Stocks Lane entrance. There were also a number of attractive and very tidy planters throughout the village and the former phone box was a real feature and used to display children's posters and local information. Judges felt that the Old Milestone, which was in good order, could be identified as a 'village feature' in the future.

The open space near the Village Hall was very well maintained and judges noted that the community maintains this area on a weekly basis. The grass was very well mown; the planted areas were completely weed free and there was no litter except in late July. The dead trees noted last year had been felled. All the verges were very well mown and judges wondered if individual residents were responsible for this good work.

Private gardens were maintained to a very high standard indeed and the judges praised those in the Mallens Croft area as "being particularly good".

The equipment and safety surfaces in the children's play area were in good condition and the Adventure play equipment was also in good order. And no litter seen.

The maps were very detailed with much information. Clearly a great deal of work had gone into their production to help judges and highlight the points of interest in Bramshall.

Bramshall was clean and tidy; and no dog mess was seen. There was clear evidence of awareness and involvement in BKV. Judges describe Bramshall as a clean, well kept, attractive village and a lot of hard work had been put in to maintain standards reached in recent years. The central open space area and standard of all the private gardens were particular highlights. Hard work has paid off and Bramshall is again the Best Kept Small Village in the East Staffordshire area. Good luck in 2018.
