BRAMSHALL SPEEDWATCH

The 'Community Speedwatch' team in the village has continued their efforts to make our village roads safer by monitoring the speed of vehicles travelling through the village, along Stone Road. During two recent sessions, once in the morning, when 52 out of 201 vehicles passing were travelling in excess of the 30mph limit and then during an afternoon session, 77 out of 430 passing vehicles were exceeding the limit.

The highest speed recorded during each of these two sessions was **58 mph**. All of these speeding vehicles were reported to Staffordshire Police for further action.

At the present time drivers travelling along the Stone Road (B5027), are warned that 'Community Speedwatch' is in operation by temporary, plastic, signs placed at each end of the monitoring area. However an opportunity has arisen for a grant from the *Staffordshire Safer Roads Partnership* to purchase 4 permanent metal warning signs that will be fixed at strategic locations on Stone Road, on Bennetts Lane and also on Leigh Lane. We have entered an application for this funding and a response is awaited.

On Wednesday 19th September the 'Community Speedwatchers' joined with around forty other active teams throughout the County, participating in 'Project Edward' (European Day Without A Road Death'). Of 499 passing cars 115 were exceeding the limit.

One new volunteer member from the village has offered to join the 'Community Speedwatch' team and is currently under training. We welcome this person to our ranks. BEST KEPT VILLAGE JUDGES' COMMENTS - BRAMSHALL

BKV posters were placed around the village and on notice boards but residents could have been encouraged to display them in house windows. Good display of children's posters at the Village Hall, in the former phone box and on notice boards. Notice boards were in good condition and notices neatly displayed. with a good range of up to date local information. The Village Hall car park was tidy (a few bits of litter in May) but in May & June the judges praised the well maintained planting areas and attractive hanging baskets.

The surrounds of the carpark of the Old Bramshall Inn were rather weedy but in May the judges wondered if refurbishment was about to take place and in June judges noted the pub had closed and was due to re-open later that month The former telephone box is now an information point and in good order. The planters were being prepared in May and the June judges said "the planters around the box were lovely."

The two benches near the play area needed repainting/re varnishing and there were also some in the churchyard which needed attention. Their surrounds were neat and tidy. The church surrounds were a little variable. In May the grass areas were tidy but some weeds were near the front door. In June judges noted some very nice planters and planting areas and attractive hanging baskets. A good allotment area but some untidy grave areas.

There was an excellent, well kept "Welcome to Bramshall" stone feature, with some lovely planting at the Stocks lane entrance. Also, a number of attractive and well maintained planters throughout the village. The Old Milestone, which looked very good could be identified as a "village feature" in future. The small open space near the Village Hall was very well mown (maintained by the community on a weekly basis). The planted areas were attractive and well kept and there was no litter. All the verges were well mown, with no weeds or litter.

Private gardens were maintained to a good standard and especially in Mallens Croft.

The maps were detailed and colourful, and the photos helpful.

There were a few bits of litter but no dog mess at all. There was evidence of community awareness and involvement, particularly through the children's posters, the telephone box information point and very good private gardens. Judges described Bramshall as "an attractive small village with lots of potential." and clearly significant work had been put in without quite reaching the sparkle of last year.
