

Starting with snowdrops in Colton, we moved to wild daffodils in Longdon, cowslips in Biggindale and bluebells around Blithfield Reservoir. Several varieties of orchids were also included and many different flowers were portrayed during the evening.

What was interesting was that some areas she had visited over several years and the dominant flowers seen in those areas varied from year to year. She also included photographs of birds she had seen during her visits and these included waxwings, which visited Colton three years ago. #### Recipe for Beef en Croute.

A great recipe for you to try on that special occasion. Ingredients

1 packet of ready made puff pastry (keep in the fridge)

1 1/2 lb of beef fillet

Beaten egg

Jar of ready made mushroom sauce

2-3 oz butter

A little brandy

Small clove garlic

Salt and pepper.

Preheat the oven to 190C

Trim any fat or sinew off the fillet and seal the beef in butter. Roll out puff pastry and place beef fillet on it. Brush the edges of pastry with beaten egg and wrap around the beef like a parcel (trim any excess if necessary as it does not want to double wrap around the beef.) Brush the whole with beaten egg and place on a baking sheet. Cook in oven for 25 minutes. Meanwhile, (and I confess I do cheat by buying a ready made mushroom sauce), put sauce in a pan and heat. I pour a splash of brandy into the sauce and also add a crushed small clove of garlic. Bring the mixture to the boil to burn off the alcohol and keep warm.

When the beef and pastry are cooked cut into thin slices\_- I put two to three slices per plate per person and serve the sauce in a jug so my guests can help themselves.

Serve with some fresh cooked vegetables and enjoy.

# **ROAD SAFETY NEWS** from Uttoxeter Rural Parish Council. **Speed Indicator Devices**.

The County Council have agreed to install Speed indicator Devices in Bramshall. These will be sited along the main road. They will not be permanent but will be located there for a few weeks and then replaced after a few weeks. Moving them is thought to be the best way to keep drivers "on their toes".

#### Speed Limit Stickers.

Staffordshire Safer Road Partnership have offered Bramshall residents the chance to be given stickers for their wheelie bins. These stickers will have the speed limit printed on them so that every week when the bins are put on the road for emptying, it will be a reminder to drivers of the speed limit. The Parish Council have asked the Safer Road Team to deliver these stickers to residents in Stocks Lane, Leigh Lane and Stone Road.
