Traffic Calming

As you know the Parish Council has been working with Staffordshire County Council to ensure that the S106 funds for traffic calming are used to deliver an effective solution to the traffic through Bramshall Village.

Most of you will have commented on the first proposed chicane design/ location and plans were redrawn after listening to residents concerns.

The second design/location went out for consultation and I am happy to say that the design will now be implemented having successfully passed through the consultation process.

You will have seen the drawing on our website in September (News Item). The work on the chicane is due to start within this month, so should be finished by Christmas 2019, this of course is weather permitting.

This year the Parish Council is funding a Christmas Tree for the village. Penny's Recipe of the Month

Onion Tart with Cheese & Sage

230g Jus-Rol fresh large shortcrust pastry.

230g chopped fried onion.

2 eggs.

150ml double cream or single.

1 tablespoon freshly grated cheddar.

3 dessertspoons freshly grated parmesan cheese

1 dessertspoon chopped fresh sage plus some fresh sage leaves.



Preheat oven to gas mark 6 electric 200°C, Pop baking sheet into centre of oven while it is pre-heating; slice onions and then whisk the cream and eggs together in a jug, add the cheddar cheese and 2 dessertspoons of the Parmesan cheese, the chopped sage and some seasoning and give everything a really good mix. Take baking sheet out of oven then place the pastry case still in its foil container on it and scatter onions over the base followed by the filling with 8 sage leaves in a circle on top and finally add the rest of the parmesan. Place carefully the tray back to the oven reduce heat to 180deg and cook for tart for 35-40mins until golden then remove from oven and leave to cool for 10mins before serving. Delicious with washed watercress. Hope you enjoy
