

#### Christingles

During Advent, a Christingle is a traditional way to help young children learn about Jesus. Each part of the Christingle has a significant meaning, which can be talked about as children assemble one of their own. The literal meaning of the word Christingle is 'Christ's Light'.

The orange represent the world. The fruits or sweets represent God's creation and goodness. These are put on sticks and placed in all 'four corners of the world'. In other words, God's love and goodness is seen all over the world. There are four of these, also representing the four seasons which are part of the wonderful world God has created for us. The red ribbon signifies Jesus's blood and sacrifice to save all people. The candle helps us remember that Jesus is the light of the world and, at Christmas, we celebrate his birth.

Perhaps you and your little one (or bigger ones!) may like to make a Christingle this year when joining the village on the Advent walk. They are simple to make and don't cost much at all.

#### How to make a Christingle

#### You will need:

an orange: some red ribbon (or red adhesive tape): glue/tape or a dress pin: four cocktail sticks: a selection of dried fruits (raisins, sultanas, cherries, etc) and/or sweets (dolly mixture, fruit pastilles, etc.): a candle and small square of tin foil (a birthday cake candle works just as well)

First, place the red ribbon around the centre of the orange and fasten with tape, glue or a pin.

Next, ask an adult to make a cross in the top, centre of the orange with a sharp knife and place the foil over the cross. Then, push the candle into the cross. The foil will catch any hot candle wax and prevent this from dripping on your child's hands.

Finally, put a selection of dried fruit and/or sweets onto the top half of each cocktail stick, then stab the cocktail sticks evenly around the base of the candle.

#### **Uttoxeter Area of Parishes - December Clergy Letter**

#### Dear friends,

As I write this letter, we are not even in Advent yet and everyone is wondering what Christmas will be like this year. Will the coronavirus pandemic still be raging on December 25<sup>th</sup>? Will it be possible for us to visit our loved ones, even if they live fairly near to us, to share presents in the flesh and relish the warmth of a beautiful family Christmas dinner?

It is possible that festive greetings may have to be on smartphones and iPads and tablets instead of face to face this year, rather than around the dinner table. Work parties and dinners look likely to be off the menu in 2020 in every part of the country as no more than six people may be allowed to gather in any area. The days of people inviting their neighbours to drop round for Christmas or New Year drinks are also on hold.

But can Christmas ever really be cancelled or ruined because of unusual circumstances? I read in the newspaper today that a Paris hospital director was calling upon President Macron to cancel Christmas. People think that it was "banned" in the time of Oliver Cromwell but, at that time, Parliament frowned upon the kind of celebrations of Christmas that were in vogue, not the fact of Christmas, disliking all the waste, extravagance, disorder and immorality of the Christmas celebrations They were encouraging people to keep it as a time of fasting and to spend it in respectful contemplation. Shops and markets were told to stay open on 25 December, and in the City of London soldiers were ordered to patrol the streets, seizing any food they discovered being prepared for Christmas celebrations!

When Christmas approaches, let's remember how lucky we are that the smell of our turkey being cooked and the sight of holly decorating our front door won't make us liable for arrest!

Advent is a time of waiting and preparation for the Church, not just the run up to the celebration of the birth of a baby, at Christmas, but a time of looking forward to when this baby, Jesus, will return; not this time as a helpless baby but in all his power and glory as King of Kings and Lord of Lords. So really, it is impossible to cancel Christmas but we just may have to celebrate it a bit differently!

May I wish you a stress free Christmas and a peaceful New Year that fulfils your expectations as we celebrate the birth of a very special baby who grew up to change the world. Whatever you are hoping and waiting for in 2021, I hope and pray that it will be worth the wait.

## Penny's Recipe of the Month

#### **Christmas Stock**

#### Ingredients:

Left over carcass / bones 1 carrot 1 medium onion, 1 leek Parsley Dried herbs



Hello Readers, well I hope all is well with you and your families. My recipe for this month is one to use after Christmas celebrations.

Whatever you have on Christmas day, either a Turkey or a Chicken when you have had enough meat keep the carcass and any bones - put in a large saucepan with 1 carrot cut into chunks, 1 onion quartered, 1 leek sliced, some parsley stalks and some dried herbs I tend to use dried bay leaves, Thyme and 3-4 stalks of parsley. Add 2pints of cold water and salt and pepper. Bring the pan to the boil and simmer with the lid on gently for 2hours. After the two hours strain the stock into a container and leave to cool. Once cool remove any fat from the surface and then freeze.

By doing this you will be able to make lovely flavoursome soups - my favourite which I make is brussel sprout soup, the flavour is great. I always remember my mother would never buy sprouts until there had been a frost as it would slightly sweeten them and give out a lovely nutty flavour, which it does. Trust me I am from Yorkshire and a farmer's daughter!!!

Hope you have a lovely Christmas despite the current situation.
