


Carol Service

Penny's Recipe of the Month

Chicken and Sweetcorn soup

1 tablespoon vegetable oil,
1 chicken breast finely chopped.
1 clove of garlic finely chopped,
1 cm piece of root ginger finely chopped.
4 oz sweetcorn kernels
1 pint chicken stock,
3 Shredded salad onions
1 tbsp cornflour,
1 tbsp fresh lemon juice.
1 egg



Heat oil in a deep pan and gently cook the chicken, garlic and ginger for 3-4mins without colouring,

Blend cornflour with little stock and add to soup pan with remaining stock and the sweetcorn.

Bring to the boil stirring continuously and simmer gently for 5-7mins.

Beat together the egg and lemon juice and then slowly trickle into soup pan, stirring with a fork to make egg strands.

Season to taste and garnish with shredded salad onions. Serve in warm soup bowls. You can then serve with a drizzle of soy sauce if you like.

We are now coming into the winter months and nothing is nicer than a bowl of homemade soup at lunchtime. I do like chicken and sweetcorn soup. Eat with some nice fresh bread rolls.

Remember Christmas is coming and the goose is getting fat. Place your order with the butcher for that turkey, or chicken or whatever meat you want.





Bramshall & District Gardening Club

At October's meeting, we were pleased to welcome Steev Stamford who spoke about his life on a narrowboat, which he and his wife have been doing for the last twenty years. At first they tried it for a trial period, but they found they liked it, so here they still are.

Their boat is on the Trent and Mersey canal and they have tried various locations over the years. Currently they are at Kings Bromley, where there are 197 places for narrowboats to be stationed. It's very rural – lots of wildlife is on their doorstep. Steev's main hobby is wildlife photography and he included some of his photos in his presentation.

The canal network in this country comprises 3000 miles of water channels, mostly 20ft wide and 4ft deep. Amazingly, this was all dug out by hand between 1760 and 1840 by gangs of navvies (navigational engineers). Structural engineers were also involved to build aqueducts (the longest is at Edstone on the Stratford-on-Avon canal) and devices to lift boats from one canal to another one on a different level – at Anderton in Cheshire and Falkirk in Scotland. Steev presented these and other, more local, engineering features and gave us a glimpse of what life was like living on the water in quite a small space.

The December meeting will be the Christmas dinner, organised for Monday 11th December and the new year will begin with a presentation on the National Arboretum. This will take place at Bramshall Parish Hall on Monday 29th January 2024 at 7:30pm.

BRAMSHALL PARISH PCC MEETING

A Combined Annual Vestry & Church meeting was held on Thursday April 20 1950 at 7.30.

The Vicar (Revd M C Clarke) presided and opened the meeting with prayers.

Minutes - The minutes of the previous meeting were read and pass unanimously.

Church Wardens - Mr G Talbot and Mr E Whittaker were again elected Churchwardens on the proposition of Mr H Statham seconded by Mr D Steele.

Sidesmen - The sidesmen were again re-elected en bloc on the proposition of Mr E Whittaker seconded by Mr G Talbot. Mr H Statham proposed and Mr G Talbot seconded that "A Sidesman not attending during the year would have his name deleted from the list" – carried.

Church Council - The Church Council was elected en bloc and Mr B Bloor and H Smith were added on the proposition of Revd Taylor seconded by Mrs Ward.

D C **Rep** - Mrs Talbot was elected representative on the proposition of Mrs E Whittaker seconded by Mrs H Statham.

R D Rep - Mrs E Whittaker was elected representative on the proposition of Mrs Ward seconded by Mrs Talbot.

Church Accounts - The accounts were given in detail by Mr J Sargeant and were adopted on the proposition of Mr H Statham seconded by Mrs Talbot. Mr E Whittaker proposed and Mr F Searle seconded that £20 be transferred to the Leek & Moorlands Building Society – carried.

Windows - The conditions of the church windows was brought forward as they were in very poor condition and the Vicar suggested that Mr T Ward, The Churchwardens and Revd Taylor and himself should examine same and report at the next PCC meeting. An amount of £30 was mentioned as to the cost which might be spent on one window.

Bramshall Report - The Vicar said that he was asking Mr Taylor to give the report on Bramshall as he had spent much more time in the Parish than he had.

Revd Taylors Report - He spoke of his Ministry among the people of Bramshall

Rogationtide, last year and this

Social life, including the fete, pre-Lent social, whist drives etc

Work among children and hoping that they would learn more and more to worship with the adult congregation.

Lent this year and the Revd G Dickenson's mid-week Lent course

The Mothers Union and its work in keeping the church clean and tidy and the difficulty in bringing in young mothers.

Confirmation candidates and the need for our prayers.

The help given by Mr Waterfall and Mr John Smith and the hope that some of us may get to the latters ordination on June 7th.

All who share in the work of the church.

The Verger - Mr Adams tendered his resignation on account of his health. He hoped to carry on until the end of this year. This was accepted with regret and it was left to the Church Council to try and find someone to fill his place.

This concluded the business and the Vicar closed the meeting with prayers.
