Anna Bateman of Church Croft- Bramshall, is travelling to Puerto Rico to volunteer for the disaster relief charity 'All Hands and Hearts' from late February- late March 2020. Hurricane Maria struck Puerto Rico in September 2017, causing catastrophic damage including the destruction of the electrical grid that had been crippled by Hurricane Irma just two weeks before. In January 2020, a 6.4 magnitude earthquake also struck the region. The team she will join in Yabucoa, PR, focus on roof repair of flat, one-story cement roofs, critical repair of windows and doors to guard against the elements, and mold sanitisation. The goal is to effectively and efficiently address the immediate and long-term needs of communities impacted by natural disasters. Clergy Letter for February 2020 - by Rev John

I don't know how many of you remember the dairy in Uttoxeter; after all it did close 35 years ago, but it was as a fresh-faced school leaver that I started my working career there in 1973. Amongst all the other memories I have of being a lab assistant (investigating the properties of milk) I clearly remember being invited to join the company pension scheme pretty much as soon as I had crossed the threshold. Well, of course, I agreed and when I saw that my then retirement date would be 2020 it seemed to be something out of science fiction, it was so far into the future that it could never come. For me 2020 was the year that would never happen! But it has, it is already here and under way.

The trouble now is that, if I'm not careful, I will keep thinking back to those earlier times with that wonderful gift 'nostalgia'; a gift that allows us to look back with fondness and a desire to return to all those great times we experienced and how we felt as younger people. When life was simpler, less complicated, all together happier, and we wish it were so today. That's how it can seem, but life was just as complex, full of ups and downs, every bit as challenging (albeit different challenges) and always social & moral issues to navigate.

Yes, we can learn from the past but we cannot live in it, neither can we expect time to stand still. Look how quickly Christmas had all but disappeared by the 27th of December. And it's not only in our secular lives that we are confronted by these emotions, which do influence our views on life today, but also within the context of our faith and its expression in our lives and within church.

Within this Uttoxeter Area, we celebrate our differences and similarities, our strengths and opportunities, the contexts in which we each minister and, hopefully, support one another through challenging times and change. Having recently completed the obligatory 'Statistics for Mission' I realise how easy it would be to become puzzled or even cynical as to why there is a need for such information; yet there is one section that looks at mission in local context and, for me, that brought into sharp focus what much of our calling is about.

When I left school I had a sense of one stage of my life finishing with the next full of excitement and hope – maybe because schooling had helped to prepare me. As we approach the season of Lent, perhaps we could use this as a time of preparation, of seeking forgiveness for the accrued cynicisms and bitterness

acquired over the years, and of letting go all those nostalgic things which are not helpful in forwarding mission.

May the Holy Spirit continue to strengthen our unity, and open our hearts and minds to the possibilities God has for this village & the Uttoxeter Area.

Best Kept Village - Judges review

Measures taken to publicise participation in BKV centred on fliers in the Parish magazine. There were BKV posters at the village entrances, Parish Hall, noticeboards, phone box and Church. Need more children's posters. Noticeboards generally good, but the one by the butcher's shop was empty. Good range of local information covering parish council, local events, activities, recycling and dog fouling awareness.

Church surrounds varied during the judging period but were generally neat and tidy with well mown grass. Signs for conservation areas, planters at the start were empty then two good ones appeared, noticeboard good with information etc. They noted that grave areas were neat and tidy and the unique church allotment area looked well cared for.

The Parish hall car park good, just a few weeds along the edges. Planting along the front wall of the hall was nice. However, the situation had deteriorated by the end of the month.

The Old Bramshall Inn surrounds were very well maintained, and the judges commented that "It is a real asset to the village now".

The phone box is now an information point – posters neatly displayed and surrounds tidy. The bus shelter was in good condition, clean with BKV poster and bus timetable. No litter or weeds. New WW1 commemorative seat looked splendid – benches near the play area were sound, tidy surrounds but could do with a clean to remove bird mess and lichen. The "Welcome to Bramshall" feature looked very good but the planting has matured so well that the feature stone is starting to get overwhelmed. Milestone on Bramshall road looked clean; the black and white fingerpost could be listed as a village feature next time.

Private gardens were maintained to a very high standard in the village – Mallens Croft especially. Play area good and safe as was the trim trail. The map was adequate; they appreciated the photos of points of interest. No dog mess evident, very little litter but a lot of weeds along footpaths.

Penny's Recipe of the Month

Hungarian Goulash

1½ lb chuck steak,
1 large onion thinly sliced,
2 tbls oil.
2 tbls plain flour
1½ pt stock.
3 tblsp tomato paste,
3-4 teaspoons paprika,
½ teaspoon caster sugar.
2½ fl.oz. crème fraiche or sour cream.



Cut the meat into cubes and peel onion then thinly slice. Warm oil in a flameproof casserole and then fry the meat and onions until onions are soft and meat is sealed. Stir in the flour, then pour over the stock stirring all the time. Then add salt, tomato paste, paprika, and sugar. Cover the stew and cook in gentle heat in oven 150deg for two hours. Stir every now and then to ensure the sauce does not burn the bottom of the pan. Stir in soured cream just before serving, Best served with Linguine or similar pasta. Enjoy!!

We are now in a new decade - 2020- who knows what this next 10 years will bring. As I sit my kitchen typing my recipe I look out across fields with clear blue sky and sunshine which is most weird, years ago you would be looking out at cold dull sky maybe with snow on the fields - as much as it is lovely it just doesn't seem right for early January.
