BRAMSHALL AND DISTRICT GARDENING CLUB

At October's meeting, we were pleased to welcome David Moreton who spoke about the Oak Tree Farm Project. This establishment, which is on a 15 acre farm near the village of Hilderstone, provides training and supported occupations for adults with learning disabilities, set in a rural environment.

The Project was begun in 1989 and, being based on a farm, gives opportunities for working with animals. Also, they have a large greenhouse which they use for producing bedding plants and cut flowers, particularly chrysanthemums. They also have a pottery and a tea room. Overall, the operation successfully gives opportunities, support and encouragement for people to learn new skills and to improve their existing ones, paving the way into sheltered employment for those people for whom this is appropriate, whilst giving purposeful occupation to others. The organisation's success was recognised when they were presented with the Queen's Award for Voluntary service in 2014.

The first meeting of the New Year will be a presentation on the National Arboretum. This will take place at Bramshall Parish Hall on Monday 29th January 2024 at 7:30pm.

A huge thank you to everyone who made Bramshall's first ever Christmas Tree Festival a success!





DIGGING INTO THE PAST.....1950 (part 2)

BRAMSHALL PARISH PCC MEETING

A meeting of the PCC was held in the Parish Hall on Wednesday May 24th 1950 at 8pm

Present: Messrs : A Cart, T Ward, S Lander, J Adams, H Statham, J Sargeant, G Talbot E Whittaker, Revd Taylor

Mesdames: McCann, A Dawson, H Statham, A Cart, Middleton, E Goodwin, G Talbot, Ward.

Apologies were received from Mr & Mrs F Searle and Mrs Armett.

Owing to the Chairman (The Vicar being detained in the Parish Church, the Revd R J Taylor opened the meeting with prayers.

Owing to the absence of the Vice Chairman, Mr F Searle, Mr H Statham was elected to the Chair.

Minutes - The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved. The Vicar now arrived took over the chair from Mr Statham.

Election of Officers -

Vice Chairman: Mr F Searle Prop. Mr H Statham Sec. Mr G Talbot Jt Secretaries: Mr J Sargeant/Mr H Potter Prop Mr E Whittaker Sec. Mrs G Talbot Auditor: Mr H Statham Prop Mr E Whittaker Sec. Mr J Adams

Windows - Mr T Ward reported that the cost to replace the damaged windows would be approximately £25 each and after some discussion it was decided to replace two windows at a cost of approx. £50. These windows to be done at once and consider the remainder in the near future.

Verger - It was reported that Mr Hambleton had decided to undertake the work of Verger with the help of Mr Adams until Xmas 1950. The amount of his remuneration would be left in the hands of the Vicar and Churchwardens. Mr Adams informed the meeting that with the exception of a wheelbarrow, fork and rake, the tools all belonged to him.

Mr D Ward - Mr Taylor thought the Church Council, together with other members of the Parish might decide to recognise the work of Mr D Ward who had recently been married and it was decided to ask him to organise a subscription list and leave it in the hands of the Vicar and Churchwardens. Mr Statham to purchase a suitable present.

Sunday School - On the proposition of Mrs |Talbot and seconded by Mr Cart, the sum of £7 be given to the Sunday School outing.

Church Insurance - The question of increasing the amount of insurance on the church was raised by Mr G Talbot and the Secretary was instructed to ask the Insurance Co., what amount would be covered with a premium of $\pounds 10$.

Mr W Torrance - The Secretary was instructed to write to thank Mr W Torrance for all the good work that he had done in connection of planting the trees in the church yard. The PCC greatly appreciated what he had done.

There being no other business the Vicar closed the meeting with prayers. M C Clarke.

DIGGING INTO THE PAST.....1951 (part 1)

BRAMSHALL PARISH PCC MEETING

The Combined Annual Vestry and Church meeting was held in the Parish Hall on Wednesday March 30th 1951 at 7.30.

There being a very good attendance, the Vicar, The Revd M C Clarke, opened the meeting with prayers.

Presentation: The business of the meeting, the Vicar announced the recognition of the long and faithful service of Mr Adams, to the Church, he would ask the Churchwardens to make a presentation. The Churchwardens when making the presentation thanked Mr Adams for all he had done and how much they appreciated his services and that a deep debt of gratitude was due to him and hoped that he would enjoy much better health than he had done in the last few months.

Minutes -The minutes of the previous annual meeting were read and passed unanimously.

Churchwardens - The Vicar thanked the Churchwardens for the faithful and loyal work and would ask them to serve again. Mr Talbot said he would like to resign as he thought he had served long enough and the office should go round but as the resignation met with replies of keep a good man in the office, it was proposed by Mr H Statham seconded by Mr J Adams that Mr G Talbot and Mr E Whittaker be asked to serve again it was unanimously carried.

Sidesmen

It was proposed by Mr S Lander, seconded by Mr Carr that the sidesmen be elected en bloc with the addition of Mr Torrance, Mr A Corbishley – carried

 $PCC\,$ - It was proposed that the PCC be re-elected en bloc with the addition of Mr A Bloor and Mr & Mrs Torrance – carried.

Diocesan Conference - It was proposed by Mrs Ward that Mrs Talbot be asked to serve again and this was seconded by Mrs Statham – carried. Mrs Talbot consented to do so

Ruridecanal Rep. - It was proposed by Mrs Statham that Mrs Ward and Mrs E Whittaker be asked to serve again and this was seconded by Mrs Talbot and they consented to do so.

Accounts - The Accounts were presented in detail by Mr J Sargeant and these were passed on the proposition of Mr H Statham, seconded by Mr E Whittaker – carried.

Vicar's Report - The Vicar in his report said how pleased he was to see such a good attendance and thanked all the officials for their help and support they had given him and the Church in the past year, also a special mention to Mr Taylor who had and was doing very good work in Bramshall. He mentioned that the quota for 1952 was to be increased to enable them to carry on without drawing on the reserves account.

He suggested the Bells might be rung by the sidesmen and that the upkeep of the churchyard would be dealt with in the near future. The window by the church door be permanently fastened. His attention had been drawn to the matter of woodworm in the picture in the church and he suggested that the Churchwardens and Mr & Mrs Ward investigate, and if only in the picture consent was given to burn the frame.

Quota - It was proposed by Mr Talbot seconded by Mr E Whittaker that £1 (one pound) be added to the Quota.

Lent Boxes - The amount of the Lent Boxes amounted to £8.16.3

There being no other business the Vicar closed the meeting with prayers.

The next PCC meeting May 16th at 7.30
