Chicken in White Wine and tarragon

Ingredients:-4 Chicken legs. 10 sprigs Tarragon. 9 floz White wine 3tbsp creme fraiche Handful of fresh mushrooms sliced. 1tbsp olive oil.



Put oil into large frying pan and fry the chicken legs until brown on both sides. Take the brown chicken legs and place in large oven proof dish in since layer only. Tip most of fat out of frying pan and pour in nine fluid ozs of dry white wine, bring to boil stirring well to release all gunk from the bottom of pan. Pour over the chicken and bake in oven for 30min at 175deg. After 30mins remove chicken from oven and tip juices into a small pan- bring the juices to simmering point add 5sprigs of fresh tarragon and the creme fresh, season to taste and add the sliced mushroom. When juices and creme fraiche sauce simmering pour over the chicken and cover either with lid of foil. I tend to prepare this in the morning and then when we are ready to eat at 7pm I heat oven to 160 deg and heat dish for 30mins. Serve with baby new potatoes and veg.

I did this dish about four to five years ago but I did not add mushrooms then, I think that by putting mushroom in it all works very well and is a lovely spring/summer recipe. Hope you enjoy.
