My name is Holly and I am an Assistant Psychologist working with Innovating Minds. Innovating Minds is a non-profit organisation that delivers psychological therapy to adults who are wanting to enter education, employment, or training across East Staffordshire (predominantly Burton on Trent, Tamworth, and Uttoxeter). Our aim is to address difficulties such as anxiety, low self-esteem, and low mood (to name a few) through 8-12 sessions of one-to-one therapy or small group therapy.

Innovating Minds is part of the BBO Evolve Project. We have recently had our contract extended and have taken on an additional Assistant Psychologist. We are therefore looking to spread the word about the services that we offer. We are currently accepting referrals.

Dear Friends,

Penny's Recipe of the Month

Chicken Stock

Chicken carcass. Vegetables. Seasoning.

Roll on spring/summer. Keep healthy and well.




This is a very difficult time for giving out recipes when shopping for food is not at its easiest. The great thing is at the moment that our butcher is open and still supplying fresh British meat. On Sunday evening we had chicken which I roasted and served with bread sauce, spring greens, fresh leeks which I sautéed in butter and crème fraiche, and roast potatoes. We shall have plenty of chicken left for Caesar salad and then I shall use the chicken carcass and make stock.

I chicken carcass put into a large saucepan. Any leftover vegetables roughly chopped and put in pan with chicken bones cover with water, add a little salt and bring to a very gentle simmer cover with lid- leave on hob for min 3hrs or more. Do top up fluid if needed. After 3hrs or more drain away the solid ingredients and pour liquid into solid container and allow to cool before freezing. The stock will keep in freezer for four months. Use for making soups or recipes that require stock.

The goodness from doing this stock is that by gentle boiling the nutrients are released and become more available which includes vitamins, amino acids and essential fatty acids making it more healthy than drinking something sweet and sugary. Please don't forget when the weather gets warmer buy some minced beef from the butcher which as you know is cheaper and better than prepacked mince from supermarket - and make your own burgers with onion, grated carrot, garlic and some grated parmesan cheese.
