Penny's Recipe of the Month

Sinhalese Linguine Prawn Pasta



450g 1lb linguine pasta,
2 teaspoons olive oil,
1/2 small onion peeled and finely chopped,
1 glove garlic crushed,
1tbsp curry paste,
1tblsp chopped fresh coriander, plus extra to garnish
1tbsp chopped fresh mint,
1tblsp fresh chopped parsley,
grated zest and juice of lemon.
Salt and ground pepper.
8oz peeled prawns.

Cook linguine in a large pan of boiling water, salted if you wish, when pasta is al dente (tender but still some resistance when bitten) remove from heat and drain, keeping some of the cooking water.

Heat oil in a large frying pan and add onion and garlic and fry without letting them colour. Add curry paste and stir fry for 20 seconds then throw in the pasta water equivalent to 10 tbsp add all the herbs prawns and lemon zest. Toss to heat through then squeeze lemon juice and lightly season. Toss cooked pasta with curried prawn mixture and serve garnished with coriander leaves.

The Church Organ

ST LAWRENCE ORGAN FUND - you may have noticed that we have started fund raising to have our church organ refurbished. The organ was constructed by the firm of Brindley in 1868 and is a single manual instrument with an additional pedal board. In terms of the history of the current church building (which is Grade II listed dating 1835) it appears that the planned 'minstrels gallery' was aborted at a late stage of construction, apparently leaving the church in a transitional period for musical accompaniment for congregational hymn and psalm singing. Although we have not yet discovered any old records pertaining to it, the introduction of the organ over 30 years later must have been greeted with great joy. The organ is regularly serviced and overhauled by John Oakes & Son Organ Builders of Stoke On Trent, but over the past few years there have been obvious signs of natural deterioration in the integrity of the sound producing woodwork. The Parochial Church Council recently took the decision to seek an estimate to restore the organ in accordance with the recommendations of Oakes, leading to a proposed outlay of almost £16k. We understand that many of our parishioners are not church goers but the church has a historical significance in the village and we would like to think that everyone enjoys walking through and around our lovely church, and people gain much from that. Remember, the church is open each Saturday and Sunday from midmorning to mid-afternoon so please feel free go in and take a look.

BRAMSHALL PARISH PCC MEETING

Annual Parochial Council meeting held in the Parish Hall at 8pm on April 5 1929.

Present: The Vicar (in the chair)

Rev. R.J. Philp & Rev F. Need Mesdames: Bentley, Buckley

Messrs: Martin, Whittaker, (Churchwardens) Bailey, Durose, Fradley Snr, Fradley Jnr, Lindop, Bentley, Whittaker Jnr, Potter,

Adams, Searle & the Secretary.

Minutes - The minutes of the last Annual meeting were read, confirmed and signed by the Chairman.

Accounts - The Secretary presented the accounts for the past year showing a balance in hand of £24.2.8 against £18.12.3 for the previous year. This was considered very satisfactory. Proposed by Mr Whittaker and seconded by Mr Martin that the accounts be passed – carried.

S.P.G. - The Vicar explained the poor work this Society was doing abroad and after a discussion it was decided that we should continue to support it. Proposed by the Secretary that we subscribe £5 this year, and that we discuss the matter again at next year's Annual meeting. This was seconded by Mr Martin and supported by Mr Lindop – carried.

Diocesan Quota - Proposed by Mr Whittaker, seconded by Mr Fradley that we pay the Quota of obligations this year £9.

The Annual Vestry Meeting held immediately after the Annual Parochial meeting in the Parish Hall on April 5 1929.

The same members being present....

Minutes - The minutes of the last Annual meeting were read, confirmed and signed by the Chairman.

Church Wardens - Mr Martin having done a term of 20 years wished to retire. The Vicar nominated Mr Whittaker as his Warden for the ensuing year. Proposed by Mr Fradley and seconded by Mr Lindop that Mr Bentley be appointed People's Warden – carried.

Elections: Mrs Whittaker re-elected Ruridecanal representative. The old Council were elected en bloc with the addition of Mr Martin to replace Mr Bentley.

Sidesmen - Mr Fradley Jnr, Searle and Lindop

Vote of Thanks - Mr Whittaker proposed that a hearty vote of thanks be given to Mr Martin for the good work he had done for the Church during his wardenship and for his generosity both to the Church and the Parish. This was seconded by Mr Lindop and supported by the Vicar and the Secretary – carried unanimously.

Mr Martin in responding thanked all present for the vote of thanks. The work he had done in the Parish had been a labour of love and although not a Warden he should take the same interest in the Church and Parish as before

Church Blinds - The Secretary was instructed to get two blinds for the windows in the Chancel as the sun was fading the new carpet.

Easter Offering - The Vicar expressed his thanks to the Parishioners for the Easter offering and also to the Church officials for all the help they had given him since he came to the Parish and he was extremely grateful to the members of the Mothers Union for the beautiful carpets they have made for the church. They had made a great difference to the interior of the church and added both beauty and comfort. This was supported by several members present and the Secretary promised to convey this message of appreciation to Mrs Lindop, the leader of the Mothers Union.
