Penny's Recipe of the Month



Leeks are one of my favourite autumn / winter vegetables despite the fact that you can buy them all the year round, I only enjoy them in the latter part of the year. We used to have them with cooked with a white sauce over them just lovely with roast lamb. However my recipe for this month is very short and simple using leeks. Top and tail the fresh English leeks then and then slice and put in a pan of melted knob of butter. Season and sweat, then add a good dollop of crème fraiche to the leeks and heat to boiling point, serve with hot roasted ham, lamb chops or whatever you fancy. Not a big recipe this month but I am going to Cornwall on a week's holiday and my mind is taken to lovely beaches, fresh fish and relaxing overlooking the sea. However before I set off to Cornwall I am going to inform you of something.

In the press there has been so much written about eating less meat etc. and going more vegan. Are you aware that if the whole world stopped eating meat we would reduce the emissions considerably but nothing like as much as if we stopped using fossil fuels? We in rich countries produce much higher proportions of emissions from fossil fuels than from meat-eating. Making fake fur and so called vegan leather is very energy intensive and often uses a vast amount of chemicals - themselves producing emissions. Reduction of meat eating will reduce emissions by 20%. We could reach that target by eating less and better. We do that by eating better beef -- that would get rid of intensive beef rearing and re-establish the importance of mixed farming and animal fertilisation enabling grassland to incorporate much more carbon. By doing that emissions are drawn back into soil and not into the atmosphere. Veganism doesn't help improve soil fertility. So let's get higher quality animal welfare back - we humans have kept animals for millennia: our country and landscape depend on husbandry and the design of our bodies makes us omnivores. Those who don't want to eat meat or drink milk fine be a vegan but please do not preach 'holier than thou' mustn't to the rest of us.
