DIGGING INTO THE PAST 1939

BRAMSHALL PARISH PCC MEETING

The Annual Vestry Meeting was held on April 13th, 1939 in the Parish Hall.

Present: Rev W E Charlton BA in the chair

Rev. A G Prime- Curate

Mr H Statham – Vice Chairman Mr F. Searle – Vicars Warden Mr J C DeVille – People's Warden

Mesdames: H Durose, E C Statham, J W Morris, V Talbot, Miss

Statham.

Messrs: J H Adams, E. Bailey, H. Durose, A Corbishley, T Eden,

J H Lindop, J W Morris, H. Potter, J Sargeant, T Talbot, J E

Ward, R. Whittaker, A. Whittaker, E J Whittaker.

Minutes - The minutes of the last Vestry were read, confirmed and signed by the Chairman.

Wardens - The Vicar expressed his gratitude to the Wardens and all Church workers for their continued loyalty and zeal. The Council nominated the Wardens for the ensuing year, Mr R Whittaker proposed and Mr Durose seconded J C DeVille. Mr Adams proposed, Mr J E Ward seconded F Searle. There being no other suggestions these were declared elected.

This concluded the Vestry meeting.

BRAMSHALL PARISH PCC MEETING

The Annual Parochial Church Council Meeting was held on 13th April 1939 immediately after the Vestry and the same company present in the Parish Hall.

Minutes - The minutes of the last Council meeting were read and confirmed. **Church Council** - The Council were elected en bloc with the addition of Mr J E Ward

Auditor: Mr R. Whittaker Jnr was re-elected Auditor. Proposed by Mr

J C DeVille and seconded by Mr Statham and unanimously

carried.

Secretary: Proposed by Mr J C DeVille and seconded by Mr Durose that

Mr Lindop be Secretary for the ensuing year – carried.

Sidesmen: Same as the previous year with the addition of Mr J W

Sargeant and G. Talbot.

Ruridecanal / Diocesan / Archidiaconal Conferences: It was resolved that Mrs Lindop be appointed lay representative.

Accounts - The accounts for the year were presented showing receipts £147.16.4 expenditure £125.1.1 leaving a cash balance in hand of £22.15.3. This was considered satisfactory. Proposed by Mr Durose., seconded by Mr R. Whittaker that same be adopted, all agreed and the accounts duly signed.

Burial Fees - The Vicar brought forward the question of a standard fee for Burials. He had enquired the charges of two neighbouring churches which were less than Mr Adams fees. After a lengthy discussion, considering the stony nature of Bramshall churchyard it was thought Mr Adams charge was not excessive for a 7ft grave the fee being fixed at 25/6d for the Sexton 2/- for tolling the bell 2/6d the Clerk and Clergy 5/- proposed by Mr Durose (Caverswall) and seconded by Mr Searle that same be the standard fee. This was accepted by Mr Adams. For re-opening a grave the fee would be less. It was suggested by the President any person not in any way connected with Bramshall a double fee would be charged whether the person was entitled to the ordinary fee or double would be left to the discretion of the Clergy.

Bishops Appeal - The Bishop's Appeal for support to build churches in the newly built areas was explained by the Chairman. The appeal had the sympathy of the Parochial Church Council. Mr J C DeVille proposed, and Mr Searle seconded that ten pounds a year for three years be given from the church funds, declared carried. It was also decided that a box be delivered to the Parishioners to contribute one penny per week.

Insurance – **War Risk** - It was decided that the Church be insured against aircraft in peace time with the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (at one penny per cent) extra yearly premium is 2/8.

There being no other business the Vicar closed the meeting with prayer.

A meeting of the Parochial Church Council was held on 28th August 1939 in the Parish Hall.

Present: Rev. A G Prime- Curate – in the chair

Mr H Statham – Vice Chairman Mr F. Searle – Vicars Warden Mesdames: Bailey, Talbot

Messrs: Durose, E Whittaker, H Potter, J Sargeant and J H

Lindop.

The subject for discussion in case of War being declared was, should the Sunday evening service be held in the Church or Parish Hall? Proposed by Mr Durose and seconded by Mr E. Whittaker that the service should be held in the Parish Hall temporarily until further arrangements could be made if necessary.

Proposed Mr Searle and seconded by Mrs Talbot that the Secretary order blinds to be fixed at once at the Parish Hall to comply with the Government regulations.

The Secretary was also requested to order a new panel in the frontal case in the Church to replace one which was worm eaten.

There being no other business the meeting closed.



Penny's Recipe of the Month

A quick question for you...

What is the difference between a Cottage Pie and a Shepherd's Pie?

Shepherd's Pie is made with minced lamb and Cottage Pie is minced beef.

Good old Cottage Pie.

I go out in the morning around 7.40am with the dog and you can feel autumn is in the air, I do love the colours in the autumn and after the very hot weather we have had it is lovely to feel a little bit of coolness in the air.

Also the time is here when I love eating Cottage Pie and my recipe is as follows:

400g of minced beef 1 large onion finely sliced,

1 spoonful of oil, 1 tsp fresh thyme.

Diced mixed carrot and swede (you can buy ready diced from Tesco)

Mashed potato which you can buy ready mashed

2 medium leeks washed and sliced thinly, just the white part

Heat the oil in a large pan and fry the onion, minced beef, carrot and swede and cook for 5mins. Put into a baking dish add a little seasoning and cover with the mashed potato. On top of the potato add the slices of leeks making sure that they have been washed first to get rid of any grit and soil. Finally on top of the leeks put some grated cheddar and then bake for 35 - 40 mins until the top is crusty and golden.
