Penny's Recipe of the Month

Well Hello Everyone, sorry no recipe this month but chat instead! Well we are now in September but it feels like summer instead of Autumn, August was a very autumnal month I felt, and not good for the farmers trying to get the fields of corn cut. Thankfully the corn is cut now and I find it a lovely walking through the fields of stubble. The other thing which I have found a good experience is the amount of blackberries growing in the hedgerows, I have been picking them and then cooking them in a saucepan with some sugar and a little amount of water. Bring them to the boil and then turn off the heat and leave to cool. Delicious served in ramekins with a drizzle of cream on top. Also now is the time for apple and blackberry pie. Years ago I could walk across our land when we were farming at this time of year and pick field mushrooms. Despite the lovely weather I think the leaves on the trees are beginning to turn slowly into the rich autumn colours. Soon the conkers will be on the ground - I do collect them and place some in each room of the house to keep at bay the spiders. I love Autumn - recipe next month .

DIGGING INTO THE PAST

BRAMSHALL PARISH PCC MEETING

A meeting of the Bramshall Parochial Church Council was held in the Parish Hall on Monday, February 28th 1949 at 7.30pm

Present

Mesdames: J Boyd, E Goodwin, H Statham, G Talbot.

Messrs: J Adams, S Lander, H Statham, J Statham, J Sargeant, F Searle, D

Steele, R Whittaker, E Whittaker, Revd R J Taylor.

Apologies were received from Mr A Cart and Mrs Ward.

The Vicar (Rev M C Clarke) presiding and opened the meeting with prayer.

Minutes - The Minutes of the previous meeting were read and confirmed.

Arising out of Minutes - The Vicar said how much he appreciated the allowance made to the Revd R J Taylor.

The Clock - It was proposed by Mr F Searle seconded by Mr S Lander that Mr Jones (recommended by Mr Sargeant) repair the necessary parts of the Church Clock and Mr Adams promised to try and get the clock going again.

Electoral Roll - The Vicar said the main business of the meeting was to compile an Electoral Roll and gave the necessary details regarding same. After discussion as to the best method of this being done, it was finally decided to place the forms in a convenient position in the Church and when completed to be returned to the Church.

Lent Services - Revd R J Taylor gave details of proposed Lent Services and these were accepted. The time of commencing the service was decided at 7.45pm. He proposed to have printed service sheets and deliver one to each house in the parish.

Sale of Work - The Vicar announced a Sale of Work was to be held in October in aid of the Church Schools as they had the sum of £3000 to find in the next 15 years. He would like to suggest that Bramshall had a "stall" of any description they would care to organise. Mrs Statham said they all realized the position Church Schools were placed in today and considered it their duty to help as the village children attended the school but at the present time necessary additions were being carried out to the Parish Hall and the money has to be raised locally to defray the cost and it was agreed to bring the subject up again.

Complaint of Parking Vehicles - Mr Statham suggested that a letter be sent to Mr Corbishley with regards to parking of vehicles in the roadway approaching the Church. Mr G Talbot seconding same – carried.

There being no other business the Vicar closed the meeting with prayers. M C Clarke

BRAMSHALL PARISH PCC MEETING

The Combined Vestry and Annual Church Council meeting was held in the Parish Hall on Wednesday 1st June 1949. There was a very good attendance. The Vicar opened the meeting with prayers.

Minutes - The Minutes of the previous meeting were read and confirmed.

Churchwardens - Mr G Talbot and Mr E Whittaker were re-elected.

Ruridecanal Representative - Mrs G Talbot was again re-elected as representative of the R D & D Conference on the proposition of Mr R Whittaker and Mr H Statham.

Sidesmen -The Sidesmen were re-elected on the proposition of Mr F Searle seconded by Mr J Adams with the addition of Mr C. Hammond, A Bloor, F Brookes, J Sankey, G Noakes. Reserves: J H Lindop, G Martin, and J H Statham

*** Mr C Hammond was my Uncle who farmed at The Oaklands Farm,
Dagdale (SAL)

Church Council - The Parochial Church Council were re-elected on the proposition of Mr S Lander seconded by Mr G Talbot with the addition of Mrs McCann, Mrs A Cart, Mrs W Armett, Mrs E Middleton.

Accounts - The accounts were submitted by Mr J Sargeant and were adopted on the proposition of Mr J H Statham, seconded by Mr G Talbot – carried

Repairs - It was pointed out by Mr J Adams that the Church Tower together with the Lightning Conductor were in urgent need of repairs, and it was proposed by Mr F Searle seconded by Mr Adams the necessary work be carried out by Messrs Ward & Godbehere - carried

Clock Face - Mr Statham asked if the Church Clock might be re-painted and after much discussion it was decided to have this done. The colour to be black and white. This was proposed by Mrs Boyd seconded by Mrs Armett – carried.

Vicar's Remarks - The Vicar in his remarks expressed his thanks to all who had worked for the Church during the last twelve months and a special word of thanks to Revd R J Taylor, Mothers Union, Sunday School teachers, and Verger. He hoped in the near future an envelope scheme might be adopted for a Free Will offering, also to commence a school of prayer and would give details later. He had asked Mr Perrins to come and preach and would also give further details later for Rogationtide.

Replacement of Commandments - The question of the replacement of the Commandments was again brought forward and it was proposed by Mrs W Armett seconded by Mrs G Talbot that they be replaced. The proposition

caused a controversy as to the design, also if they must be in the Church, and it was left in the hands of the Vicar to consult the Archdeacon for the necessary information.

Letter from Mr Torrance - A letter was read from Mr W Torrance re the planting of trees in the churchyard and the Vicar suggested this be brought up at the next PCC meeting.

There being no further business the Vicar closed the meeting with prayers.
