Parish Hall Update

We are hoping to re-open the Parish Hall during September, as we assess the situation on a 'class at a time' basis. This is not a straightforward task as this requires all risk assessments being completed to ensure conformance to all government rules and regulations.

All residents of Bramshall do have an involvement with the Hall as it is a community building, and anyone can assist in its maintenance and running – from keeping the area around the building clean and tidy to actually serving on the committee. The Parish Hall is also a business, and during this period of lock-down the Hall has not received any revenue. This continues to have a significant financial impact as there are ongoing expenses (particularly utilities) until the Hall is back in use again. Penny's Recipe of the Month

Lemon Crunch Pie



Ingredients: 1/4 lb Digestive biscuits. 2oz butter, 1 level tablespoon caster sugar.

For Filling 1/4 pt single cream.
6oz can (smallest size) Nestlé's Condensed milk. Finely grated rind and juice of 2 large lemons.

Finely crush biscuits. melt butter in a saucepan and add sugar and remove from heat. Mix. the crumble biscuits into the butter and sugar and stir well. Turn the mixture into a flan dish. Press into shape round the base and sides with the back of a spoon. Bake in the oven (gas 1) or 200deg for 8mins. Remove from oven and allow to cool. Do not turn out of flan dish as it will crumble!!!!. Mix together the cream and milk in a bowl with the lemon rind. Add lemon juice a little at a time and pour into the flan case then chill for several hours. This flan will keep in the fridge but needs to thaw out a little before serving otherwise the base will be very hard. Enjoy.

This is a good recipe to bake especially in this hot humid weather - no one wants to be slaving away over a hot stove at times like these do they????
