The year 1927... a very busy year!

BRAMSHALL PARISH PCC MEETING

Parochial Church Council held in the Parish Hall at 7.30pm Jan 14 1927.

The Vicar in the chair.

Present: Mrs Whittaker, Dakin, Potts & Loverock

Messrs W. Ellaway Smith, Whittaker, Lindop, Martin, Fradley Snr, Fradley Jnr, Adams, Rev. Boone and the Secretary.

Coke Shed - It was proposed by Mr Lindop and carried that the coke shed now be built with asbestos roof, wooden sides and a brick foundation and painted.

Insurance - The insurance on the church was discussed and it was decided to increase the insured amount to £2,000.

Diocesan Quota - The Secretary was instructed to pay for 1927. Mrs Whittaker paid 1926!

Parish Tea - It was decided to hold the Parish Tea on Jan 22nd on similar lines as last year.

The meeting then concluded. L. Knights Smith

Annual Parochial Church Council meeting in the Parish Hall at 7.30pm Feb 15 1927.

The Vicar in the chair. Present: Mrs Whittaker, Deakin, Loverock Messrs Whittaker, Statham, Adams, Bentley

Accounts - The accounts for the past year were presented showing a balance in hand of £32.5.1 Adoption of the accounts proposed by Mr Statham, seconded Mrs Whittaker.

Insurance - The Chairman stated that the old policy had not been found. It was decided that a new policy (for £2000) be obtained.

Coke Shed - With further reference to the Coke Shed an opinion had been expressed that it would be better and not much more costly to construct the building of brick instead of wood on brick foundation. It was resolved that Messrs Martin and DeVille should have the shed so built. Proposed by Mr Whittaker, seconded by Mr Statham.

Parish Tea - A hearty vote of thanks was accorded to the Ladies Committee for the excellent arrangements they had made for the recent Parish Tea. It was decided that the balance in hand be handed to the Parish Hall fund.

Elections - The following elections were then made.

The names of Messrs Bentley and DeVille were added.

Hon. Secretary / Treasurer - Mr J C DeVille was unanimously reappointed as Hon. Secretary / Treasurer proposed by Mr Martin, seconded by Mr Bentley.

The Annual Easter Vestry meeting for the appointment of Church Wardens was held in the Parish Hall at 8pm on April 21st 1927.

Present: The Vicar in the chair.

Messrs: Martin, Whittaker, Adams, and the Secretary.

Vicar's Thanks - The Vicar said the past year had been a very successful one and he again expressed his thanks to all who had helped, particularly the Church Wardens who were always ready and willing to help the Church and Parish. He also expressed his thanks to the congregation for the Easter offering.

Church Wardens - The Vicar re-nominated Mr Martin as his Warden for the ensuing year. Mr Martin proposed Mr Whittaker be re-elected, seconded by J C DeVille. The Wardens expressed their thanks for the confidence placed on them

Parish Fees - The Vicar read a letter he had received from the Ecclesiastical Commissioners showing a revised scale of fees. It was decided to bring the matter forward at the next Parochial Council meeting. The meeting concluded with prayer.

A meeting of the Parishioners was held in the Parish Hall at 8pm on May 31 1927

Present: The Vicar in the chair. Mesdames: Whittaker, Bentley.

Messrs: Woodward Snr, Woodward Jnr, Whittaker, Lindop, Ellaway Smith, Statham, Torrance, T. Durose, Goodwin, Fradley Snr, Fradley Jnr, Potter, Adams, Searle, Deakin and the Secretary.

Services - The alteration in the time of service was first discussed and it was decided that to meet the wishes of a number of members of the Golf Club a Golfers Service on the second Sunday in the month at 10am (this service to be open to anyone who like to attend) to be followed by Holy Communion, as usually held on this Sunday.

Pulpit - Removal of the pulpit was next discussed. It was proposed that this be done and a new one erected. After a very healthy discussion this was passed unanimously. The Secretary announced that £39 had already been promised which was considered very satisfactory. (The Vicar £5, Mrs Curwen £5, Mr Whittaker £5, Mr Kynnersley £5, Mr Lindop £5, J C DeVille £5, Mr Martin £5, Mr Woodward £3, Mr W. Ellaway Smith £1)

Pulpit - The Vicar explained that the meeting had been called to consider the revised designs of the proposed new pulpit. One design was very much admired, and it was proposed by Mr Lindop and seconded by Mr Fradley that the current price be obtained for same and discussed at the next meeting.

New Services- The Vicar expressed his profound satisfaction at the results of the Golfers services.

Leaving - The Vicar announced that since the last meeting the Bishop had offered him the living of Brewood which he had reluctantly accepted. His health had not been good for some time, and he felt the work was too much for him. The meeting expressed their regret – all felt sure that our loss will be Brewood's gain.

New Pulpit & Prayer Desk - The Vicar said he had received a quotation for the Pulpit and Prayer Desk which came to £65.11.6 and £28.5.0 (Total £93.16.6) then there would be the cost of taking down the old pulpit and erecting the new one. He thought we might try a local firm to see if we could get it done cheaper or would we like to let the matter stand over for the new Vicar to assist us. It was proposed that we go on with it at once. Proposed by Mr Adams, seconded by Mr Whittaker that Mr Millward, Denstone and Mr Lynes of Abbots Bromley be asked to give an estimate not only for the Pulpit and Reading Desk but to include the removal of the old pulpit and the erection of the new one. Any repairs to the floor being extra they also be asked to inspect the church before giving an estimate.

In the absence of the Vicar it was proposed that Mr Whittaker take the chair.

Minutes - The minutes were read, confirmed and signed by the Chairman. The Vicar, Rev. F. Need arrived apologising for being late due to car trouble he then took the Chair.

Pulpit Costs - The Secretary reported that he had received the following quotations for Pulpit, Prayer Desk and seat.

Messrs Wilcocks, Wolverhampton	£93.16.6
Messrs James & Willis, Birmingham	£98.10.0
Messrs Harrison, Lichfield	£199.15.0
Mr Milward, Denstone	£80.0.0

These were discussed and it was proposed and carried that Mr Milwards tender of £80 be accepted; this to include fixing in the church. It was also proposed that the Secretary make the best terms he can with Mr Brown to remove the old pulpit and make good the wall and floor. It was proposed that Mr Milward be asked to supply a copy of the working drawings to Mr Ellaway Smith and to give an approximate date when the work will be completed. The Vicar promised to get an account of the Architects fees.

Sunday School Prizes - Proposed by Mr Whittaker and seconded by Mr Adams that Sunday School prizes be paid for out of church funds.

Prayer Books & Parish Hall Payments - The Secretary was instructed to pay £2.6.7 for Prayer Books and £1.10.0 to Mr Sam Bennett for the use of Parish Hall for the last 3 years, this includes both Council meetings and Sunday School.

Parish Tea - It was decided to have the Parish Tea on Jan 19th on similar lines as last year.

Penny's Recipe of the Month

Pasta Cream Bean Dream



Ingredients:

11oz spaghetti, 11oz runner beans sliced on the diagonal,

1 tbsp olive oil,

1 onion sliced.

6 rashers of streaky bacon cut into small pieces.

7oz creme fraiche,

3 tbsp vegetable stock.

1 little gem lettuce, finely shredded,

salt and pepper, freshly grated parmesan cheese to serve.

Cook spaghetti in large pan of boiling salted water until cooked, then add runner beans for the last four minutes of cooking time. Meanwhile heat the oil in a frying pan and cook onion and bacon for 5minutes until nicely browned. Stir in creme fraiche and stock and simmer gently for 1 minute without boiling. Drain the spaghetti and beans and return to the pan stir in the creme fraiche sauce add the shredded lettuce and season to taste. Transfer to serving plates and sprinkle on the Parmesan and plenty of black pepper.

This is the time when runner beans are at their best, we grow our own and they are just lovely. If you like Linguine or Tagliatelle, then you can use it instead of spaghetti.
