September

September always seems like a new start of sorts, new school years starting, some with school changes or first days away, students off to start at colleges and universities. Every where there are ways to equip yourself for this new start. It's a new page waiting to be written on—probably a good time to revisit those New Year's resolutions...

This happens in the last third of the year when ,traditionally, we are gathering up the harvest and preparing for winter. The name September comes from the Roman word Septem which means seven as it was their seventh month. They believed September was nurtured by Vulcan, god of fire and forge.

September's flower is the aster which can be any of a range of colours from white to red to pink, purple or yellow. Star shaped they were named after the Greek word for star and the god Astraea who cried because there were not enough stars in the sky ... as her tears hit the ground they turned to asters. Also known as Michaelmas daisies because of their flowering time the



first one to enter England probably came in 1633 brought back by botanist John Tradescant the younger.



Abbots Bromley celebrates in September with their Horn Dance, a ritual custom from 1226, where the Horn Dancers – 6 Deermen, a Fool, a Hobby Horse, Bowman, and Maid Marian perform their dance at locations round and through the village starting at St Nicholas Church with a blessing.

Penny's Recipe of the Month

Salad of boiled potatoes, avocado, and cress

1 large avocado (ripe), 700g of scrubbed new potatoes 3packs of cress (washed). Olive oil, juice of 1-2 lemons, salt and freshly ground pepper



Cook new potatoes in salted boiling water until tender then drain.

Slice the avocado in half and remove the stone then slice into thick chunks and place in a bowl.

Slice any big potatoes in half otherwise leave them whole and add to the bowl.

Throw in the cress and add a couple of lugs of olive oil, lemon juice, then season to taste. Put on a large plate and scatter any remaining cress.

This is great with cold chicken or any other cold meats.

DIGGING INTO THE PAST - 1938

BRAMSHALL PARISH PCC MEETING

The Annual Vestry Meeting was held on April 20th 1938 at 8pm in the Parish Hall.

Before opening the meeting the Vicar satisfied himself that all had signed the Electoral Roll.

Mr J H Lindop – Vicars Warden, Mr F. Searle – People's Warden

Mesdames: Statham, Bayley, Talbot, Durose (Caverswall)

Messrs: Talbot, Sargeant, Durose, Statham, Steele, Adams,

T Eden, Potter, Cotton and the Wardens.

Minutes: The minutes of the last Vestry were read, confirmed, and signed by the Chairman.

Wardens: The Vicar expressed his gratitude to the Wardens. All others who had given their services in any way during the year and congratulated them on the cleanliness of the Church, also pleased with the attendance and the happy atmosphere at Bramshall Church.

The Vicar nominated Mr Searle his Warden and Mr Lindop proposed Mr J C DeVille as the Peoples Warden, seconded by Mr Adams.

This concluded the Vestry meeting.

conference - failing Mrs Lindop, Mrs Talbot kindly

consented.

Accounts: The accounts for the past year were presented showing a balance in hand of £35.16.7 after discussing various items it was considered very satisfactory. Mr Searle proposed, and Mr Durose seconded that the accounts be adopted.

Heating: It was unanimously agreed and accepted by Mr Adams that he would do the heating of the Church and his usual work such as mowing the grass, cutting the hedges etc for seven pounds ten shillings per annum.

Sunday School: The Sunday School was again granted five pounds from the church funds for the children's outing.

There being no other business the meeting closed with prayer.

Bramshall Spotlight on... David Howell

Another fascinating story from a Bramshall resident ...

In September this year, David will be publishing his first book entitled - "Speak Up, Listen Down"

After serving for 30 years in Staffordshire Police, David decided to put pen to paper and log the ups and downs of his amazing career. It was literally "ups and downs" as David spent 18 fascinating years working within police air



support, initially managing the Central Counties Air Operations Unit at Halfpenny Green Airport. This was the consortium helicopter unit serving both Staffordshire Police and West Mercia Police. Whilst managing and being the training officer at the unit he was fortunate in 2008 to travel to Jamaica to train their military and police in helicopter operations. Following the tragic police helicopter crash in Glasgow in 2013, which crashed onto the Clutha Pub, David was asked to organise a team and helicopter to travel to Scotland to support their police service in their hour of need. Being the first police officer in the UK to have been authorised by the Civil Aviation Authority to train Crew Resource Management, his training skills were sort after across the whole country - allowing David to visit and train police officers and pilots.



After his unit at Halfpenny Green was sadly closed in 2016, following three years working with the newly formed National Police Air Service, David moved to London to manage the UK's largest air base the world renowned Lippitts Hill. Some of his experiences there included flying with Presidents Obama's aerial security detail in 2016, attending the terrorist attack on Westminster Bridge in 2017 and dealing with the tragic fire at Grenfell Tower as well as policing Notting Hill Carnival.



Unfortunately, during the latter years of his career within air support, David experienced bullying in the workplace. This negative experience took its toll both mentally and physically, leaving a profound impact on David's experiences within policing.

The book seeks to unravel and reflect upon the spectrum of those remarkable experiences, from walking the streets of Stoke-on-Trent to flying with President Obama. A totally unique career that will never ever be replicated again but one that was very much focused on the very building block of any organisation - people. Specifically, the individual and what innate talents they have to offer whilst safely coping and dealing with the complexity of their specific role.

Why people seek to bully others and why people are themselves bullied within the workplace is also explained, based around his own very personal experiences and having obtained a deeper personal insight via psychometrics.

After leaving air support in 2019, David entered the world of change management, teamwork and leadership training utilising his people training skills whilst employing ground-breaking psychometrics. Those 30 years of policing experience are now aiding businesses and organisations better understand their people - highlighting who is suffering from burn out and in need of much needed support.

Watch out for a future date at Bramshall Village Hall when David will be providing a photographic history of his police career and will include an interactive question and answer session.


